

Information for New Pilots

As I have not seen you before for a pilot's medical, I have attached some information to help make sure that you come prepared.

There are a number of things that regularly cause problems:

Contacts

If you wear contacts then I need to check your vision without any correction, with glasses and with contacts (depending on whether you have come wearing your contacts or glasses be prepared to either take your contacts out or to put them in)

Photo Identification

You need to bring with you some form of photo ID (eg drivers licence, passport,) as I need to sight this. This is a CAA requirement and without this I cannot do an assessment or examination

Medical Problems

There are a number of medical problems that can complicate the examination or delay the assessment. To help me decide whether I need any tests before I see you, or further information from you, please complete the 4 page application form (attached) and send this back to me either by fax or email. This way I can then check to see whether there are any issues and advise you what to bring, or tests to do, etc.

All initial pilot examinations require fasting bloods (lipids & glucose) so once I have the 4 page application form I can then send you the laboratory request form. This way you can get the blood tests done before you see me if you so wish. If you have some medical conditions, other tests may be required as well. I can advise you after reviewing the 4 page application.
